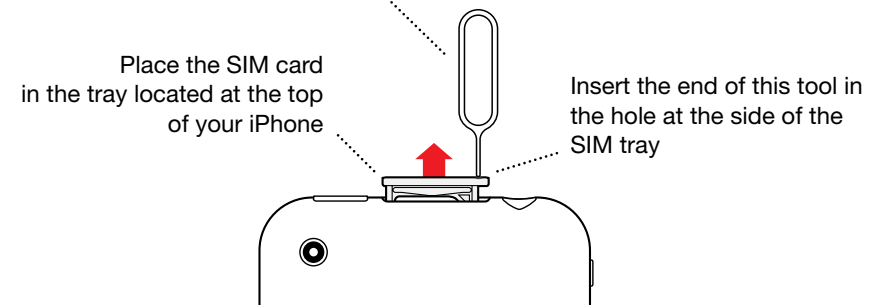
4 steps to activate your iPhone 3G

1. Download and install the latest version of iTunes on your computer:
www.apple.fr/itunes/download
2. Insert your Orange SIM card in your iPhone 3G using the SIM eject tool that you will find in the documentation packet.
3. Turn on your iPhone 3G and connect it to a USB port of your computer using the cable provided. iTunes will open automatically or launch iTunes manually.
4. Follow the onscreen instructions.

Enter your PIN code if required and use your iPhone 3G.

Note: Your computer should always be connected to internet during activation.

To eject the SIM tray of your iPhone, use the tool included with your iPhone accessories



your secret code (the PIN code of your Orange SIM card)

Enter the 4-digit PIN code that secures the access to your iPhone. You can personalize the code through the menu of your iPhone 3G.

(1) These steps require a valid email address, your bank card number if you want to set up an iTunes account, a computer (operating systems: MAC OS X 10.4.10 or later; Windows XP™ or Vista™) and an Internet connection.

syncing your contacts

If your contacts are saved on your SIM card, you can import them directly to your iPhone 3G.

Note: Only one number per contact will be imported.

To do this :

1. Select: Settings > Mail, Contacts, Calendar
2. Scroll down to “Import SIM Contacts”
3. Choose this option.

It can take a few minutes to import your contacts depending on how many there are.

Another solution :

Before putting your SIM card in your iPhone, you must save you current contacts.

To do this :

1. Transfer your contacts from your old mobile phone to the email program on your computer (Outlook Express, Microsoft Outlook, Yahoo, etc.) using a USB cable.
2. Then sync your iPhone using iTunes by selecting your email program in the Info Tab of iTunes.

To check your consumption send **conso** to **8444**. Information about your consumption and time will be displayed on the screen of your iPhone (first three SMS free of charge per day and then Rs1.00 per additional SMS).

after-sales service

If your iPhone breaks down, contact Orange Customer Service for a diagnosis. You can also go to your Orange Shop of Mauritius Telecom for assistance.

precautions for use

The SAR ⁽¹⁾ rate of your iPhone is 0.878W/kg.

Recommendations to reduce radiation exposure

- Use the headset whenever possible and especially in the event of frequent or prolonged use. The headset is also a more convenient way to use your phone.
- Keep the mobile phone away from sensitive areas such as the belly of pregnant women or the lower abdomen of adolescents, especially when calling.
- Use your mobile telephone in places where reception is good. Reception quality is indicated by bars on your phone's screen. Above four or five bars, reception is good for making your calls. This will not always be the case in some places or situations, in particular in underground parking garages, elevators, trains, cars, or simply in areas where network coverage is poor.

Safety measures

In some places or situations such as airplanes, hospitals, service stations and garages, the use of phones is forbidden. It is therefore imperative to strictly follow the safety rules in each of these situations and to turn off your phone when required.

To avoid a risk of interference, persons with implanted electronic devices (pacemakers, insulin pumps, neural stimulation devices, etc.) must keep the mobile phone at least 15 cm away from the implanted device and use the phone only on the side opposite the device.

Using the phone while driving, even with equipment that makes it legal, is dangerous because the distraction created by talking increases the risk of an accident. It is therefore recommended never to phone while driving and not to consider that a hands-free device makes it safe to do so.



Using a mobile phone as a music player

Users are advised that listening to the device at high volume over an extended period can cause hearing damage. When used with the headset provided, this device has a certified sound pressure level of less than 100 dB.

Users are advised that replacing the headset provided with this device by a headset by that the manufacturer or importer indicates is not compatible may modify the sound pressure values so that they no longer comply with current standards.

In any case, it is recommended that users set the volume at a moderate level so as not to damage their hearing.
